Friday 16th October 2015 Of Horses and Men

Benedikt Erlingsson, 2013, Iceland; Cert 15; 81 mins. Described by one reviewer as 'wondrously strange', 'Of Horses and Men' is set in a rural Icelandic community whose inhabitants are smallholders and horse-breeders. Breathtaking scenery and darkly comic mishaps combine to celebrate the bond between a people and their horses. Truly original cinema, not to be missed! (Subtitles)

Friday 4th December 2015 *Pride*

Matthew Warchus, 2014, UK; Cert 15; 119 mins. Inspired by an extraordinary true story, Pride tells of a group of gay activists who decide to help a community of Welsh miners during their lengthy strike in the summer of 1984. This heart-warming film will make you laugh, cry and feel immensely proud. There's a stand-out performance from Imelda Staunton and Bill Nighy is at his laconic best.
