This is the true-story of James Bowen (Luke Treadaway), a homeless busker, whose life is changed when he is befriended by a stray ginger-cat. A tale of second chances, this is a warm-hearted and amiable social drama, which won the 2017 UK National Film Award for Best British Film.

Zaza Urushadze, 2013, Estonia | Cert 15 | 87 mins
The first Estonian feature film to be nominated for an Academy Award for Best Foreign Language Film, Tangerines is set during the 1992/93 war in Abkhazia and tells of a tangerine farmer who find himself having to offer tense hospitality to one wounded fighter from each side. Played beautifully, with humour and compassion, this film is a morality tale addressing issues of conflict and reconciliation.

Burn Burn Burn

Chanya Button, 2015, UK | Cert 15 | 106 mins
Grieving over the death of their friend Dan, Seph and Alex are shocked to receive a posthumous video message from him instructing them to take a road trip across Britain to scatter his ashes (kept in a Tupperware box in the glove compartment). This is a very clever little film, moving at times and darkly hilarious at others, a road trip packed with surprises. Brilliant cameos from Alison Steadman and Julian Rhind-Tutt.
