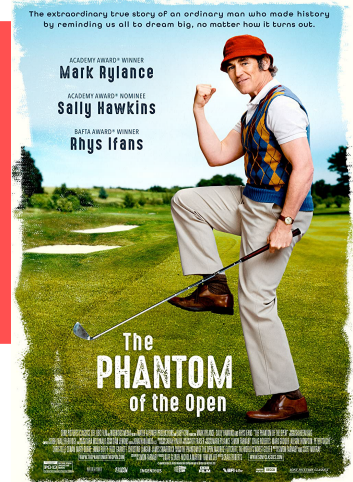


Friday 15th September 2023

Craig Roberts, 2022, UK | Cert 12A | 106 mins

The true story of Maurice Flitcroft (Mark Rylance), a dreamer and unrelenting optimist, who manages to gain entry to the 1976 British Open Golf Championship qualification round, despite being a complete novice. This is an uplifting and moving comedy drama about shooting for the stars, no matter what hand you're dealt. A perfect opener to our new season.

Quo Vadis, Aida? (subtitles)

Jasmila Zbanic, 2021, Bosnia & Herzeg. | Cert 15 | 101 mins
Set in July 1995 in Srebrenica, Bosnia, this powerful wartime film follows Aida, a translator for the UN, as she risks everything to protect her family from the Serbian army who are taking over the town. The subject is horrifying but the screen is hard to look away from, as the situation becomes a powder-keg of tension. Where are you going, Aida?

Joyride

Emer Reynolds, 2022, Ireland | Cert 15 | 94 mins

Joy (Olivia Colman) is a headstrong solicitor whose plan to offload her new born baby to her sister is derailed when Mully, a vulnerable 13-year old teenager (Charlie Reed), steals their taxi, unaware that they are in the back seat. There follows a wild journey across Ireland, stealing cars, hitch-hiking, catching ferries and breaking police barricades. This is a heart-warming, bittersweet tale of two unlikely travel companions who find solace in each other while on the run from their pasts.
