USA/Germany | 2024 | Cert 15 | 95 mins

During the 1972 Summer Olympics in Munich, an American sports broadcasting team must adapt to news coverage when the Israeli team is taken hostage by a terrorist group. The film is set almost entirely in the studio, 100 metres from the unfolding events, which they film live and we are treated to a suspenseful drama of media in crisis, interlaced with archive footage and some strong performances, notably from John Magaro and Leoni Benesch. It is only Magaro's character, Geoffrey Mason, who raises any ethical issues and so the question remains - should this have been broadcast live at all? Make up your own minds!

Friday 26th September 2025 A Real Pain

(Director: Jesse Eisenberg)
USA | 2025 | Cert 15 | 90 mins

This film offers a poignant exploration of family, heritage and the complexities of human relationships. It follows cousins David (Jesse Eisenberg) and Benji (Kieran Culkin) as they tour Polish holocaust sites to honour their late grandmother and are forced to confront their relationship. Benji is outspoken and free-spirited, standing in stark contrast to the reserved David and their friction fuels both humour and heartbreak, revealing deep-seated pain and insecurity on both sides. Great performances, notably Oscar-winning from Culkin as the 'Pain'.
